Do-it-yourself yard and flower bed maintenance

Do you like to weed, trim, and prune the areas around your unit, rather than leaving all the work to the landscaping crew? If yes, we have some new practices for you to follow:

- All yard waste, clippings, etc., MUST be placed in a yard waste bag purchased at Home Depot, Lowe's or other stores in town. These bags are sturdy and biodegradable. Anything in a plastic bag will not be collected. Loose debris will not be picked up.
- You may place one bag at the end of your driveway (not on the lawn, please) each week on the day the mowers are working. If you have more than one bag, please hang on to it for another week.
- Mowing is scheduled for Thursdays (like last year). Pay attention, however, if the day changes due to rain or some other circumstances.
- DJs plans to collect the bags at the end of their workday, so please do not put anything in your driveway the night before.

How do I access the association's website?

You should have a password assigned to you by our webmaster, Sally Mulder. If you have lost it, please contact Sally for a new one.

Why would I want to look at the website? There are so many reasons!

- There is a directory so you can know your neighbors.
- There is a <u>"contact us"</u> link that allows you to direct questions or concerns to specific board members. Click on "about us" and there is a drop-down menu.
- There is a ton of <u>information</u> about recycling dates, about the by-laws and rules, about estate sales, about parking and RV's, about policies and practices, etc., etc., etc.
- There is a list of approved <u>vendors</u> who you might hire for work in your unit.
- There are <u>forms</u> for modification requests, extended absences, setting up auto-pay, etc., etc., etc.
- There is a <u>marketplace</u> where you can list things for sale to our community (like deck furniture, blinds or curtains that fit our windows, other miscellaneous stuff)
- There are records of board minutes and newsletters

How often should I check the website?

As often as you have questions about how the condo association operates, or what our policies are. Probably a couple times a month would be useful.
